The London Greener NHS team will be running a Greener NHS Week, from **Monday 13th May 2024 to Friday 17th May 2024**. The events are virtual. The Green Week is aimed for healthcare staff to gain an understanding of the NHS sustainability agenda, meet sustainability experts working with the NHS and hear from Trusts that have benefited from sustainability projects.

All sessions will be bite-sized (up to one hour in length) and will be recorded. We will upload recordings to FutureNHS, Greener NHS hub.

The aims of the week are to:

- To celebrate successful / on-going green and sustainable projects.,
- Share best practice, create opportunities to work collaboratively and support the development of anchor monitoring and evaluation.
- Provide an opportunity for networking.

Core narrative:

The event is designed to empower and enable health institutions and staff across London to become greener both as institutions, for patients, for the workforce and the community. From clean air to the cost-of-living crisis, we know that the climate emergency is a health emergency. We experience it as people, as we live our lives, and we share it as leaders across the NHS.

This year's London event will allow key leaders to reconnect Trust and ICB leaders, and those with influence across health to share learning, to celebrate the progress we have made, and to engage on how to deliver positive change quickly.
